Jake Neidling Demo

Jake Neidling performed a demo turning a three piece Elevated Candy Dish. He demonstrated the techniques for mounting the individual pieces of wood and how each one was turned using great tool control so not to cause much tear out to lessen sanding. Even though he didn't use a drawing but he instead did it free form the end piece turned out as wanted. He mentioned that the proportion of the base and stem he was using was 50% to hold the weight of what was going to be held. It was also noted that if it was only going to be an art piece the rule of thirds would apply. Good job Jake.
